

PUBLIC NOTICE:

A Public Meeting will be held on Wednesday, March 7, 2012, at 10:00 AM in the second floor conference room of the City Hall Annex/Bank of America building, 1203 N. Hudson St., Silver City to present information on a proposed amendment and boundary increase to the Silver City Historic District to the Silver City Design Review Board, property owners and the general public. The historic district is currently listed in the State and National Registers District (NR# 375377, SR# 197).

The amended nomination proposes to expand the period of significance from 1930 to 1960 to allow the inclusion of additional important landmark buildings. This amendment adds a block of Bullard Street, which lies immediately south of the original (current) district boundary. The block is bound by Bullard Street on the west, East Spring Street on the north, the "Big Ditch" on the east, and East San Vicente Street on the south.

Silver City, as a Certified Local Government, will make a recommendation to the State Historic Preservation Division on whether the Design Review Board and/or chief elected official support or oppose the changes to the Silver City Historic District nomination and boundary increase.

A second Public Meeting will be held by the Cultural Properties Review Committee (CPRC) on Friday, April 13, 2012, at 1:00 PM to consider the amendment and boundary increase for the Silver City Historic District, taking into account Silver City's recommendation. This meeting will be held in the Old Senate Chambers on the second floor of the Bataan Memorial Building, 407 Galisteo St., Santa Fe. Silver City officials and the public are cordially invited to attend and to provide testimony. The CPRC makes final decisions on State-Register listings and makes a recommendation to the Keeper of the National Register for National Register listings.
